Dear Families and Friends,

Welcome back to school for 2019. We are very happy to have our returning students back and to welcome all our new students and their families to the NAPS community. We have had a wonderful start to term 1 with the school already humming with great learning. There is nothing more gratifying than a walk around the school, or meeting everyone after school and having them share their days with such excitement. Included later in the newsletter is a list of our staff members to assist you with communication with the school. Students in kindergarten to year 6 also have new signs on the courtyard to help them with lining up each morning. Supervision of students begins at 8.40am on the courtyard. When students arrive at school they should come to the courtyard and leave their bags near the area they line up. They do not need to take them to their classroom. They can then play on the courtyard until the bell goes just before 9.00am. Teachers are often in meetings in the mornings, or in preparation for the day and may not be in their classroom for supervision. Kindergarten teachers will let families know when they will begin joining us on the courtyard for morning lines.

School App and Class Dojo

The school has an app through Skoolbag which can be found in app stores for both Apple and Android products. Search for North Ainslie Primary School and follow the instructions to install. We use the app to share information and provide details of school events. We are currently updating the app and events can easily be transferred to your own calendar. Please see the attached information sheets on the app.

We also use Class Dojo to share the happenings of the school. If your child/ren are already on Dojo and you have provided permissions, they can be transferred from their old class to their 2019 class. If they are not already on Dojo, look out for notes and instructions from their teacher.

Medication

If your child suffers from any known allergies, please collect a Known Medical Action Plan from the front office. You will also need to provide an up-to date action form to the front office if your child is asthmatic or anaphylactic. A back to school asthma checklist is attached at the end of this newsletter.

If your child requires medication, please bring it to the front office with clearly labelled instructions.

School Drop-off and Pick-up

We do understand that parking can be difficult during peak times of drop off and pickup up after school. Please read all signage in the carpark and park only in bays. The area closest to the school in the carpark on Sherbrooke St is only for pick up and drop off and cars should not be left at any time. These procedures are in place to ensure our students are safe as they arrive at school and then leave in the afternoon. Here is some advice from the Directorate on ideas to help with the school drop-off and pick-up each day.

Think before you park...and keep our kids safe!

With school now back for the year we are encouraging all parents to make parking safety a priority!

At North Ainslie we strive to be

This means:

- keep clear of 'no stopping' and 'no parking' zones
- don't park in bus zones on school crossings, across footpaths or driveways; and
- don't double (or triple) park!

Remember - it's okay to park a little further away from the school and walk the rest of the way!

Consider - having a pre-determined meeting spot agreed with your kids. That way if you are a little late, they know where to wait.

Think – visibility around schools and if your car may be blocking the view of crossings for other motorists. Also be mindful when entering or leaving parking spots – look twice!

Be kind – to other road users and pedestrians and also if you see any parking officers in the area – they are doing their job and working to keep our kids safe!

Note - licence Plate Recognition (or electronic chalking) vans are now actively monitoring schools. Penalties range from \$114 upwards to \$600. Details at www.act.gov.au/accessCBR

Back to school asthma checklist

1. ASTHMA ACTION PLAN

See a doctor for a signed Asthma Action Plan or Care Plan. Most schools require an up-to-date plan for each student with asthma at the start of the new school year.

Evidence tells us that using an Asthma Action Plan can help to reduce hospitalisations, improve lung function and reduce the number of days off school.

While with the doctor, why not combine this with a check-up for your child's asthma, including a check on their device technique.

2. RELIEVER MEDICATION

Check with the school about their medication policy and work with the staff to find the best way to manage your child's asthma medication, including before physical activity (where applicable).

- Medication and devices are clearly labelled with your child's name
- Medication is in date and with sufficient medication remaining

3. TALK TO SCHOOL STAFF

Make time to talk with the class teacher and the school nurse (where applicable) about your child's asthma, their Asthma Plan and their usual triggers, symptoms and medication.

Also talk to your child's sport coaches and supervisors of other school activities. Don't forget to keep staff up-to-date with any change to your child's asthma management.

Use this valuable time to:

- Go over your child's Asthma Plan
- Discuss the signs of asthma for your child
- Show them your child's asthma medication and demonstrate how to use it
- Talk about the extent to which your child can self-manage their asthma
- Provide details of how to contact you when:
 - They have asthma symptoms
 - They use a reliever medication at school
