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Online eSafety Resources for Families of Young People

The Office of the eSafety Commissioner provides advice and support to all Australians in understanding how to be safe in the online world. To support your young person to navigate their digital world and avoid harmful online experiences, the following information can assist you in having the hard-to-have conversations about online safety and setting boundaries.

Your support and guidance can give your young person the confidence to make sound decisions online – and know where to go for help when they need support or advice.

Be engaged, open and supportive

- Get involved. Share online time with your young person as a part of family life. Talk about favourite apps, games, and websites.
- Keep lines of communication open. Ask about their online experiences, who they are talking to and whether they are having any issues.
- Reassure your young person they can always come to you, no matter what. Let them know you will not cut off internet access if they report feeling uncomfortable or unsafe when online – this is a real concern that may stop your child from communicating with you openly.
- Get to know the devices you and your young person use and set them up for privacy and online safety.
- Use parental controls as appropriate to set boundaries.
- If you feel your young person needs support, please maintain contact with your school so you can work together to support them. Seek professional help if your young person is distressed or shows marked changes in behaviour or mood, remembering that organisations such as Kids' Helpline and Beyond Blue can help.
- If you feel your young person is in immediate danger or at risk of harm, call Triple Zero (000) and stay with them until they are safe. You can find additional information and resources at the Office of the eSafety Commissioner to support you and your young person.

Semester 2 Reports – Kindergarten to Year 6

Reports for kindergarten to year 6 will be sent home on Tuesday, 8 December which is in week 9 of this term. Families who receive more than one report, will receive the second via an email directly from the school not from SAS. Preschool reports are sent home by the school on one of the days your child attends preschool in that same week of school.

Wellbeing at NAPS

Today your child will be receiving a note about Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) and how we are implementing this model at NAPS next year. The work on designing our model of PBL began in 2019 with staff, students and the School Board and is now ready for launch. This work in PBL is part of what we continue to do to enhance our culture of wellbeing here at North Ainslie. PBL is a whole school, research-based approach to embedding the values and attitudes of our ways of being at NAPS. You may remember that we also launched a new acronym at the beginning of the year to help us remember the attributes - "At NAPS We R.O.C.K." The learner profile attributes have been collated into this acronym to support students to see their connections to each other and will be used as our overarching guide for PBL. The PBL philosophy for NAPS brings these two elements together and you will be hearing lots more about it next year. We hope to have you all play a huge part in sharing this with your children.

North Ainslie Primary School aims to encourage and promote a positive school culture that enhances learning by maintaining a safe, respectful and supportive learning environment through consistent practice. We believe the development and demonstration of the learner profile attributes are foundational to students becoming internationally minded, active and caring community members who respect themselves, others and the world around them.

As part of our PBL focus, at North Ainslie we are:

A friendly reminder that this year's Crazy Camel Art Fundraiser is available for online ordering. All students have had the opportunity to produce a piece of special art which can be made into a selection of different products. You can choose from high quality notebooks, calendars, pillowcases, tote bags and other items with your child's artwork on the front, with a significant portion of each sale going to the NAPS P&C. They are a great source of Christmas and birthday presents for family and friends. The closing date for orders is this coming Monday 23 November. Please see below for more information.



Due to COVID, this year this fundraiser has to work a little differently. In a recent email you will find a unique URL link to your child's class artworks. Each artwork has a unique identifying number underneath. This number is the code you will use to purchase any products with your child's artwork on. Artworks do not have full names on them to support privacy.

Some children have written their first names on their artworks. Please do not forward this link to others so we can maintain and support privacy.

To order:

1. Got to the URL for your child's class. – This URL is in an email already sent to parents and carers – Subject: 'Crazy Camel Art Fundraiser information and Ordering'
2. Find your child's artwork and note the number underneath. This is best done with your child present (hopefully they remember what they created!), but some artworks have the child name/initials on the front.
3. Once you have noted the number for your child, click the link to begin ordering at the top of the page ("To begin ordering please click here").
4. Select the product(s) and quantities you want to order, enter your child's number and class and complete the order.

The closing date for orders is Monday 23 November. Please see answers to frequently asked questions below.

Q&A

I forgot something / can I place another order for the same child? - Yes, you can make additional orders until orders close on Monday 23 November.

I'm not sure about quality, can I see it first? - Feedback from parents in previous years is that the quality is excellent but if you would like to see for yourself, we will have sample products at the front office and a stand outside the school at pickup/drop off on Monday 16 November (weather permitting) for you to view samples.

When will I receive the products I ordered? - We expect the products to be sent home the week beginning Monday 7 December.

How will I receive my products? - All products will be sent home with the child who produced the artwork.

We are a multi-household family, can we receive our orders separately? - Generally, all products will be sent home with your child on the day the orders arrive. If you need special arrangements, please reach out to napsfundraising@gmail.com <<mailto:napsfundraising@gmail.com>> before ordering and we will try to accommodate your request.

Help! I can't find my child's artwork - Child numbers approximately correspond with each child's roll number, but not every child submitted artwork. Email napsfundraising@gmail.com <<mailto:napsfundraising@gmail.com>> and we can help you find it.

Wow there is some great art here – can I order the artwork of a child that is not mine? - Yes and no. The ordering system allows you to order for any child but the order will be sent home with the child who produced the artwork. In other words, if you order for a child that is not yours, you will not receive the products.
