


Earn and Learn

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ACTSmart's Eco Challenge – Easter Egg Foil Competition




Thank you to the families who participated in ACTSmart's Eco challenge by collecting foil Easter egg wrappers. By participating in the competition, North Ainslie saved 2.2kg of aluminium foil from going to landfill! In total, 21 Primary Schools registered for ACTSmart competition and over 10 thousand students participated. As a result 44.55kg of Easter egg foil will be directed to recycling centres rather than to landfill. Congratulations to Margaret Hendry School for winning the prize.

You can continue to recycle your foil at home by placing it in the mixed recycling bin. Just remember, it needs to be about the size of a credit card or larger.
