Dear Families and Friends,

We have had another wonderful week here at North Ainslie with lots of learning for both our staff and students. Our year 6 students had another check-in for their Exhibition which is coming up in week 6 and is the culmination of their time in the Primary Years Programme. Thank you to all the families who attended and have continued to support and play a vital role in this learning with their children. Our senior students continue to practise their piece for the Northside Spectacular next week and I have been lucky enough to attend some rehearsals and have seen the improvements that have resulted from their hard work.

On Monday all teachers attended workshops with other PYP schools from across Canberra, sharing practice and discussing how schools were working with the changes in the Enhanced PYP. Kirsty Miller and Jarryd Heywood did an outstanding job of hosting a session on the year 6 Exhibition with great conversations and ideas shared amongst all schools.

This week, school leaders attended sessions on preschool and the National Quality Framework and ways in which we can continue to use it and the Early Years Learning Framework to provide high quality learning experiences for our youngest students. In the afternoon, teachers were then able to work together to talk about their preschool improvement plans and share best practice across schools. Both presentations

were from the Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) and provided us with the latest in research and best practice.

We had several people attend professional learning with Christine Topfer who is an Australian literacy expert whilst we continued to learn about the 10 Essential Literacy Practices. These practices are also research based and apply from preschool to year 12 and have been shown to improve learning outcomes for students. North Ainslie is currently focusing on providing feedback to students with an emphasis on conferencing with students and helping them to set learning goals. Ask your child if they know what their reading and writing goals are and how they are working towards achieving them.

We had a group of our Indigenous students and their friends attend the Indigenous Cluster Day with schools from all over north Canberra. They were treated to a wide range of learning experiences which included music, visual art and PE. A great day was had by all of the students and a big thank you to Sarah Buckley and Meredith Regan who coordinated our activities and attended with the students. A very big thank you to Jakki Kennedy who is a parent, a proud Wiradjuri woman from Cowra and the owner of Sariel Art. She shared her amazing talents with the students who attended yesterday. Once finished, the artwork they all produced will be on display here at North Ainslie.
