Our year 1/2 students were very fortunate to have a visit from Larry Brandy, an internationally renowned storyteller to help launch their final unit of inquiry for 2019. He shared many stories with our students as well as some very interesting artefacts that inspired a lot of questions. The 1/2 students were able to dress up as bush animals and create some performances of their own. Larry Brandy is a Wiradjuri man from Condoblin who has been awarded an ACT Children's Week Award and a Churchill medal, which was presented to him by the Governor General. Larry has produced two books for children. In 2008, Larry was the NAIDOC Aboriginal Person of the Year.



This week our year 5/6 students had a wonderful time learning about Indigenous music and dance with Duncan Smith. He painted the faces of our students before engaging them in the cultural learning experiences. They learnt some complex dance moves and he played the didgeridoo and talked a lot about its significance. Did you know the Aboriginal word for didgeridoo is Yidaki? Duncan finished up with a question and answer session. After a question from the students, Duncan talked about the careful use of fire to care for country which made areas for animals to graze and which was done when the conditions were right and safe. The feedback from all students was outstanding and they were inspired by the sharing from Duncan and his family.

Yesterday we hosted our 2020 preschool and kindergarten families with an afternoon Information Session and a chance to visit classrooms. I love getting a chance to meet new families and to see our future students excited to be entering preschool or making the step up to 'big school'. Thanks again to the staff who worked so hard to make this event so welcoming and successful.

Balsamic Salad Dressing or Vinaigrette

- 3 teaspoons olive oil
- 1 teaspoon aged balsamic vinegar
- 1 teaspoon honey or maple syrup
- 1/2 teaspoons Dijon mustard (optional)

In a small bowl, whisk together the balsamic vinegar, Dijon mustard, maple syrup or honey. Then gradually whisk in the olive oil 1 tablespoon at a time until fully emulsified and creamy.
